### 4.1 HOD/TIC reporting

### 4.2 Technology - John Robinson

John entered the meeting at 6.32pm

Highlight was surviving the year, positive nature and attitude of the kids astounded me.

Mat raised the question around staffing in the Technology Department - are there online resources that could be used? John noted a course online form the UK that he utilizes at times but there is not anything up to par in NZ like this.

Recruitment issues - There are not enough Technology Teachers available in NZ we will most likely need to look overseas. Only one trained Technology teacher on our staff at present.

We seem to have a number of students in classes who have been put in a Tech class as they cannot get into a class they would prefer - these students can be hard to keep motivated as they do not want to be in the class.

Covid again played a part in learning and motivation last year. Messages around courses being available online deterred students from staying focused within class. Students found exams stressful, for example needing to write long paragraphs - Mat noted is this because they are not learning this in the classroom.

Discussion had around woodshop remodeling. Focus on keeping things tidy and packed away - only have out what you need to use.

NCEA Achievement rates - Andrea asked if we could have a little more information as a follow up.

John noted that the new LAT Tech teacher is settling in nicely.

# 4.3 Music - Stephen Hinds

Stephen Hinds entered the meeting at 6.50pm.

Highlight of the report - Getting credits from students all through lock down - Sen Macmaster was outstanding. The Pasifica students were amazing.

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Outdoor learning space - using old Harkness quadrangle, lovely space for musicians.

Big increase in numbers in Year 10 for music lessons. Students seem to be genuinely interested in music. This should translate to a reasonable group at Year 11.

Level one, two and three as one class was challenging - this year it is going to work better with level one as a class and level two and three together.

Senior students in Level 3 seemed to loose interest in those extra two weeks we had last year. Once students had enough credits they seem to stop engaging.

Greg asked if a budget had been done to replace any older instruments? Maybe this is something we could fundraise for in the future. PA systems, microphone stands need to be upgraded.

Stephen to put together a wish list for Greg to look over.

Stephen to include some numbers on NA, A etc.

## 4.4 Agriculture - Elizabeth Prentice

Elizabeth Prentice entered the meeting at 7.01pm.

Highlight of the report - Process of deciding where we were moving with the Ag department and having the boys input - they were more Ag science driven and the whole process was really neat. Their reflection and feedback has been vital to getting this pilot up and running.

14/15 Year 11's in Ag Science around 19 Year 11's in Practical Ag.

Boys are very engaged in the big 3 - Soil, pasture and stock. Could we utilize other departments in some of these areas. Can we cross over with subjects like Math's and English.

During last year Elizabeth received a hip replacement - it was hard on the boys to have a reliever, later on through her recovery she was coming in one day then two a week to help with the students and get into more practical work.

Some Ag students who are heading out and working in holidays etc seem to find it hard to transition back into being a student.

Elizabeth spoke to her results included in her report - Elizabeth to share some more info with the Board.

Some students are put in practical ag because its the only practical subject on that line - some of the Year 11 and 12;s that were put in there struggled as they didn't have the foundation from the previous year.

Greg asked if Elizabeth felt she had the resources she needs - in a whole yes, sometimes we have patchy wifi but generally pretty happy.

## 4.5 Science - Jeremy Mansell

Jeremy Mansell entered the meeting at 7.18pm

Highlight of the report - Harry Wilson receiving Scholarship in Biology - great for Erin as she had been feeling underwhelmed.

Greg noted a common theme amongst reports, students opting out of standards as they have credits - what can we do about this? Darryl had the idea to limit number of standards and put more emphasis on exams - I think this is a great idea.

Challenged learners, how can we help them? Jeremy noted that by the time these particular students reach Year 12/13 they most likely wont take a science path - but we need to be looking at these pathways and making sure students are capable.

Do the boys understand that science is something that builds on itself and if they don't put the work in through Level 1 they will struggle at Level 2? Jeremy noted that most of the students in 101 realize this fact and put in the work.

Beginning, proficient and advanced - most students in Year 9 are sitting at around a level 3 but we need to get them into the 6's by Year 11 so that they can confidently walk into exams.

BYOD - can be difficulty in the junior school as a lot show up without a device. Now that we are doing a lot more blended learning it poses a problem.

Across the board internals were not great - what do you think was the cause of this? Study skills, time management

Are you enjoying the 6 day timetable - Yes, love it stops students missing the same class every week when they are out for other things.

There is a good culture amongst the department - we are building and working on new ways to keep students engaged. I am working with a new accounting teacher at WGHS and Sarah is working with a very experienced History teacher from Timaru.

Junior school - how are you going with integrating more NZ history as per Ministry guidelines? We are working to bring in NZ topics within other topics - looking to bring in more about the NZ Land Wars.

## 4.10 PE Ray Boswell

Ray Boswell entered the meeting at 8.32pm.

Highlight of your report - Cooper Kennedy today with the encouragement of the class he jumped into the deep end of the pool and swam across. A student in outdoor education who cant swim was doing bubble floats and duck dives. Getting students with no confidence to the top of the ropes is another key highlight.

Year 9's lack of resilience - over the last 3 years it appears to have lowered considerably. Need to work on getting skill levels and fitness up. The structure of the 6 day timetable is going to make it harder to build on these as we now have two sessions over 6 days instead of 5, that is a negative form our point of view around the timetable change.

Scott Mayhew noted that the boys have a lot of integrity and demonstrate excellent sportsmanship.

Is there any coalition between lack of risk taking physically and academically? The critical thought process is a bit of a bump for us - does the teaching team look into this? Not particularly.

With the cross country this year we built in walk stations and rest stations which brought in more students to compete - this helped with building resilience.

Physical Education is in need of some better resources but these things are major.

#### 4.11 Maths Emma Prosser

Emma Prosser entered the meeting at 8.50pm

Highlight from your report - We survived, there was a time there I thought the Math's department was going to self implode staff wise. Assessment wise we stayed about the same maybe slightly better, our endorsements were down. Big highlights were Diederick Van Basten and Seth Thomas getting endorsements.

There was anxiety within the classroom - were teachers going to be there, socio factors - parents employment etc. I know a teachers job is to teach but a huge part of our job is building relationships, we found we were needing to reassure students things would be ok. We felt students needed school to be a constant but it was difficult during some stages.

This year is looking more positive, we have two new staff members, relatively new teachers - one is going ok, one is needing a lot of support. Moral within the department is mostly great.

Students have come back and it is looking for the most part that they are engaged - adjusted to the masks really well, timetable changes well. There is covid chatter but it doesn't seem to be affecting the classroom yet.

The boys general attitude to learning in math's - they hate it, they hate learning math, they enjoy the teachers but don't seem to see Math as highly valuable. Mat raised the question, could Ag and Math work together to make it more appealing? They already do have a bit of cross over, we try to utilize it as much as we can.

Its exciting that we have been selected to be a part of the new NCEA Math pilot which we will put our 103 class, top year 10 and middle stream year 10's classes. I am a true believer in externals and that at some point in your life you will need to be able to preform under pressure - for those students that don't do well in externals we have a financially ready for flatting course - covering flatting, budgeting, filling in work forms etc.
